
EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Endeavour engaged PricewaterhouseCoopers Advisory Limited ("PwC") to assess key indicators across Endeavour's programmes from September 1, 2023 to August 31, 2024. This report highlights the outcomes which align with Endeavour's goals, and demonstrates how Endeavour's programmes and initiatives are achieving measurable, positive impacts in the community.

HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE:

- How many young people have engaged in Endeavour's programmes from 2015-2024.
- Who Endeavour serves through its programmes (gender, age, ethnicity, nationality, school enrolment).
- How Endeavour's youth participants and their families perceive the impact on personal development, peer interaction, skills development and interest in STEAM and sailing after engaging in Endeavour's programmes.
- How teachers perceive the effect of students' participation in Endeavour's programmes as it relates to academic achievement, interest and proficiency in STEAM subjects and other behavioural changes.
- How Endeavour's donors view the impact of Endeavour's programmes.
- How Bermuda's sailing organisations view the impact of Endeavour as it relates to exposure, interest, and retention of youth sailors.
- How Bermuda's marine organisations view the impact of Endeavour's programmes on Bermuda's youth and exposure to the maritime industry in Bermuda.

Help Bermuda's youth from all backgrounds to build self-confidence and develop life skills.



Leverage sailing as an effective tool for teaching STEAM education.

KEY FINDINGS

Feedback from youth participants, teachers, and parents highlight the positive impact that Endeavour creates for young people across Bermuda who engage in Endeavour's programmes.

Findings demonstrate that as a result of participating in Endeavour's programmes:

- Endeavour connects diverse youth from across Bermuda while engaging them in hands-on learning activities featuring Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math or **STEAM** education through sailing.
- Students are **more interested in learning about STEAM subjects** and have an improved understanding of science and math concepts.
- Youth build confidence and develop life skills including **problem-solving, communication, teamwork and leadership**.
- **Young people of all backgrounds, skills and abilities** are exposed to sailing opportunities, with many indicating their first sailing experience is through Endeavour.
- **Young Bermudians have a greater awareness of maritime career pathways** and are **better prepared for securing employment** with enhanced skills, hands-on experience and industry connections.




802 students from 21 schools in Bermuda gained access to over 2,400 hours of experiential education during the 2023-2024 year including over 900 hours of academic instruction in math and science.



216 students aged 12-14 years, from 12 schools, were engaged in the Endeavour Graduate Programme in 2023-2024.



12 Assistant Instructors volunteered 640 hours of community service in July and August 2024 to support students learning to sail in the Endeavour Graduate Programme.



10 students aged 15-16 years, from 4 schools, completed a week-long training to develop their coaching skills and were successful in achieving their Assistant Instructor certification in July 2024.

ENROLMENT IN ENDEAVOUR'S PROGRAMMES

ENDEAVOUR STEAM EDUCATION THROUGH SAILING PROGRAMME

Enrolment in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme is linked directly to school enrolment as this opportunity is offered to ALL students ages 11-12 years old from public, private and home schools.

100% of students in their first year of middle school from all schools in Bermuda engaged in the 2023-2024 Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme: **521** students from **five** public schools, **eight** private schools and homeschool students.

ENDEAVOUR GRADUATE PROGRAMME

Students are invited to continue to develop their skills and knowledge in the Endeavour Graduate Programme based on their participation in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme with an emphasis on students who have not sailed prior to Endeavour and are interested to continue sailing.

Out of **216** students who engaged in the 2024 Endeavour Grad Programme; **51%** of students were from public schools and **49%** of students were from private schools.

ENDEAVOUR NO LIMITS SAILING PROGRAMME

44 students from **six** public schools engaged in the 2023-2024 Endeavour No Limits Sailing Programme.

ENDEAVOUR ASSISTANT INSTRUCTOR PROGRAMME

Out of **10** students who engaged in the 2024 Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme: there were **four** public school students, **four** private school students and **two** from overseas schools.

ENDEAVOUR MARITIME CAREER SPRINGBOARD PROGRAMME

Out of **11** students who engaged in the 2024 Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme: there were **six** high school students, **four** high school graduates, and **one** GED student.



SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

100% of students reported **improved teamwork, communication, problem-solving and leadership skills** after participating in the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme.

100% of young Bermudians reported they **enhanced teamwork, communication and problem-solving skills** following their completion of the Endeavour Maritime Springboard Programme.

100% of parent respondents indicated their child **enhanced their communication skills** after participating in the Endeavour No Limits Sailing Programme.


99% of students reported **improved teamwork skills** and **96%** of students reported **increased problem-solving skills** as a result of participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

90% of students reported **increased confidence on the water** after completing the Endeavour Graduate Programme.

84% of students reported **better knowledge and understanding of water safety** after participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

521 students ages 11 to 12 years old from 13 schools engaged in hands-on STEAM activities learning about sailing geometry, buoyancy, wind power and wind measurement, marine conservation and Bermuda's maritime history during the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

97% of teacher respondents believe that Endeavour's STEAM activities align with their lesson plan and in-class curriculum and believe that students were more interested in learning about STEAM subjects as a result of participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.



91% of students reported they were more interested in learning about **Science**, 92% reported an increased interest in learning about **Engineering** and 82% reported an increased interest in **Math** after participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

71% of students reported they were more aware of STEAM career pathways as a result of participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

70% of students reported that they improved their understanding of STEAM education concepts as a result of participating in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.






ENDEAVOUR PROGRAMMES & STAKEHOLDER FEEDBACK

01. ENDEAVOUR STEAM EDUCATION THROUGH SAILING PROGRAMME

The Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme offers a five-day interactive learning experience for all students aged 11-12 from **five** public schools, **eight** private schools, and home schools across the Island.

BELOW REPRESENTS STUDENT PARTICIPATION FROM EACH OF THE SCHOOLS IN THE 2023 - 2024 PROGRAMME.



Endeavour's inquiry-based curriculum integrates Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Math (STEAM) hands-on learning with practical sessions on the water to complement what students learn at school. By creating connections between what they are learning on the water and in the classroom, students become more excited about learning

and strengthen their understanding of math and science. Endeavour's STEAM through sailing curriculum includes modules on sailing geometry, buoyancy, wind power and measurement, simple machines, sailing fundamentals, weather patterns, ocean conservation, and Bermuda's maritime heritage.



BUOYANCY

- How does the boat balance (stay upright) on the water?
- What happens to the boat when the gravitational force is less than the buoyant force?



MEASURING WIND & WIND POWER

- How can we measure the wind if we can't see it?
- What is the maximum wind speed you can sail a boat in?
- What is apparent wind?
- Why can't you sail into the wind?



SAILING GEOMETRY

- How does geometry affect sailing?
- What shape are sails and why?
- What is the angle of the 'No Go' zone?

Learning modules are aligned with the Cambridge curriculum math and science learning objectives that are implemented in Bermuda's public schools. Students report an increased interest in learning about STEAM as a result of their participation in the programme.

Students report improved self-confidence, teamwork, communication and problem-solving, along with a greater appreciation for environmental stewardship and Bermuda's maritime history as a result of participating.

The programme is supported by Endeavour's long-standing collaboration with the Bermuda Ministry of Education and schools, ensuring lessons are relevant and enrich students' learning experience. It encourages enthusiasm for STEAM and sailing while offering exposure to STEAM-related and maritime careers.

Each week, two groups of students and teachers engage in activities at Endeavour East in St. George's and Endeavour West in Dockyard, coming together on Fridays in Dockyard.

113 teachers from **14** schools contributed **1,500** hours of support for the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme during the 2023-2024 school year.

100% of teacher respondents believe that students benefited from their participation in the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme.

Endeavour also partners with the Bermuda Cancer and Health Centre's SunSmart Programme to promote healthy sun protection habits.

Endeavour is committed to sustainability and eliminating single-use plastics, and all participants receive a reusable water bottle. Students and teachers join Endeavour team members for weekly beach clean-ups and have collected thousands of plastics and debris, followed by discussions on sustainable living. In partnership with the National Museum of Bermuda, students engage in an interactive scavenger hunt focused on Bermuda's maritime heritage. Students also learn about the physics of sailing and apparent wind on Blo'Karts (land sailing vessels).

Endeavour's STEAM Education through Sailing Programme fosters critical thinking through inquiry-based learning to prepare Bermuda's youth for a rapidly changing world. Endeavour continuously refines lesson plans and collaborates with educational partners to ensure the best learning outcomes.

ENDEAVOUR X US SAILING REACH STEM EDUCATOR TRAINING

Since 2015, Endeavour has partnered with US Sailing's Reach Initiative to provide training for Endeavour team members and educators across Bermuda. US Sailing's Reach Initiative uses sailing to inspire youth to enjoy learning while exploring STEAM education and careers. This partnership enables teachers and instructors to network, share ideas, and enhance their skills in engaging students of all abilities.

Since 2015, **120** educators from across Bermuda have completed the US Sailing Reach STEM Educator Course in partnership with Endeavour enhancing their teaching strategies for engaging youth with diverse learning abilities.

02. ENDEAVOUR GRADUATE PROGRAMME


The Endeavour Graduate Programme provides a pathway for students ages 12-14 who have completed the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme to further develop their skills. Students are evaluated based on teamwork, respect for others, listening skills, willingness to learn, overall effort, and their interest to continue learning to sail.

Those with the highest values are invited to participate in training sessions during the summer, and school breaks and weekends during the fall and spring terms.

This programme fosters diversity by bringing together students from different backgrounds, helping them build skills both on and off the water. Some students and their families have reported that their sailors have formed new friendships they wouldn't otherwise have made.

71 students took part in the Endeavour Graduate Programme during the fall 2023 and spring 2024 terms, and **145** new students were engaged from **12** schools during the 2024 summer programme.

Endeavour Graduates were asked if they agreed or disagreed with the following statements based on their Endeavour experience. The chart below displays the percentage that agreed with the statement:

- 19 Endeavour Grads were awarded youth sailing scholarships from the Bermuda Sailing Association to support their sail training with local sailing clubs in July and August 2024
- 14 Endeavour Grads took part in the 2023 Bermuda National and Open Optimist Championships for their first regatta experience. They represented **six** schools: Dellwood Middle School, Mount Saint Agnes, Sandys Secondary Middle School, Saltus Grammar School, Warwick Academy and Whitney Institute Middle School.


03. ENDEAVOUR ASSISTANT INSTRUCTOR PROGRAMME

The Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme offers a leadership development opportunity for students **ages 15 years and older** who have completed the Endeavour Graduate Programme.

The programme focuses on coaching and advanced sailing skills for high school students interested in becoming sailing coaches. After successfully completing the programme and achieving their Assistant Instructor certificate they are invited to volunteer to assist with the Endeavour Graduate Programme and gain community service credit.



In July 2024, **ten** students from five schools completed the Endeavour Assistant Instructor Programme, of which **100%** successfully achieved their Assistant Instructor (AI) certification. They joined **six** returning Assistant Instructors volunteers to dedicate **640** hours of community service in July and August 2023.

Students represented **five** schools; the chart below represents participation from each of the schools.

04. ENDEAVOUR MARITIME CAREER SPRINGBOARD PROGRAMME

The Endeavour Maritime Career Springboard Programme is a seven-week career development initiative for young Bermudians **aged 16 years and older** who are seeking employment in the maritime industry, that equips them with training and career connections to build skills and broaden exposure to maritime career pathways.

2024 marks the **seventh** year of the programme and Endeavour's partnership with the Bermuda College Athora Division of Professional and Career Education (APACE) Division.

A key part of the seven-week programme includes interactive career site visits with a range of maritime employers to broaden awareness of the different career pathways and training opportunities available as well as providing tips for how to jumpstart their career while at the same time building a network of contacts in the maritime industry locally and overseas.

Young Bermudians benefit from maritime career exposure and exploration, skills development, practical training, and hands-on experience as well as growing their network of support so that they are better positioned to work in the maritime industry.

Young Bermudians also benefit from the opportunity to achieve internationally recognised qualifications from the Royal Yachting Association (RYA) including:


- RYA Sailing Levels 1, 2, 3
- RYA First Aid
- RYA Seamanship
- RYA Safe & Fun Safeguarding
- RYA Powerboat Level 2
- RYA VHF Marine Radio - Short Range Certificate (SRC)
- RYA Safety Boat
- RYA Dinghy Instructor Award

Seven participants were high school students: two from CedarBridge Academy, two from The Berkeley Institute, one homeschooled student, one student from The Adult Education School and another from an independent school who balanced academic commitments while being immersed in the programme. The remaining **four** participants were high school graduates.

Of the eleven participants, ten first started sailing through the Endeavour STEAM Education through Sailing Programme when they were 11-12 years old, of which eight completed the Endeavour Graduate Programme.

One participant, Sivaja' Perinchief, completed Endeavour's Assistant Instructor Programme, and has volunteered hundreds of hours in support of younger sailors in the Endeavour Graduate Programme. Sivaja' was recognised as Endeavour's 2023 Youth Volunteer of the Year.

Endeavour surveyed all 11 participants and **100%** responded regarding their employment status. The majority of participants were students who were not employed and seeking employment at the start of the programme:

04. ENDEAVOUR NO LIMITS SAILING PROGRAMME

Endeavour facilitates the No Limits Sailing Programme to provide experiential learning opportunities for students who are on the autism spectrum or have developmental challenges who are enrolled in public schools across Bermuda. Students engage in hands-on sensory learning activities that focus on STEAM concepts applicable to sailing that are complimented by practical sessions on the water. Learning modules explore wind and weather patterns, buoyancy and sailing fundamentals in a safe and fun learning environment.

44 students between the **ages of 6 to 18 years old** from **four** public primary schools, **one** public middle school, **one** public high school took part in the No Limits Sailing Programme with Endeavour during the 2023-2024 school year.


34 teachers contributed **900** Hours of support during the No Limits Sailing Programme.

36 teachers and **220** youth, including Endeavour Grads, No Limits sailors, and Assistant Instructors, took part in SailGP Inspire Learning interactive experiences.

75 students & teachers joined Endeavour and KBB for a beach clean up with SailGP teams.

75 people, including Endeavour Grads, teacher chaperones, education and community partners, and Board members, participated in SailGP tech tours.

Endeavour partnered with SailGP Inspire for an online fundraiser, presented by SailGP CEO and Endeavour Chair Emeritus Sir Russell Coutts, to support future pathways for youth sailing in Bermuda. Proceeds support youth sailing scholarships for Endeavour Grads who wish to continue sailing at local sailing clubs.



16 Endeavour Grads received scholarships in fall 2023-spring 2024 to continue sailing at **3** sailing clubs in Bermuda.

SAILING ORGANISATION PARTNERSHIPS

Endeavour provides support and pathways for young people who have completed Endeavour's programmes and are interested to further advance their skills through sailing, with emphasis on supporting those who might not otherwise have access to sailing opportunities.

Endeavour is honoured to partner with youth sailing organisations across the island to increase access and exposure to sailing for Bermuda's youth.

Endeavour is grateful to the Bermuda Optimist Dinghy Association and Bermuda Sailing Association for helping to secure scholarships and financial bursaries to support youth sailing activities at local sailing clubs and regattas, further improving access to sailing for youth across Bermuda.



Revenue


Endeavour raised **\$1,285,204** during the period, **78%** from sponsorship income, **18%** from grants and **4%** from donations and value in kind (VIK) support.



Expenditure


